1. Use the CA ECE Workforce Registry

The Quality Counts CA (QCC) State Leadership recommends all local QCC participating sites and the trainers and coaches who support them register and use the California Early Childhood Education (ECE) Workforce Registry (Registry) to assess and track their professional qualifications.

The California Department of Education, Early Learning and Care Division has been requiring those who access its Quality Improvement professional development activities to register with the Registry since January 2017, and all of its trainers to put their training offerings and/or training attendance in the Registry since July 2017. To

date, there are over 57,000 individuals from all counties across the state participating in the Registry.

Local QCC Participating Sites

All participating sites will be required to use the Registry to assess the qualifications of their staff by July 2020. This will result in more consistent data across consortia. Consortia should begin working with QCC sites to submit documentation for verification: transcripts, permit, credentials, and professional development documentation now. Trainers for QCC Participating Sites

The QCC Training/Trainer Approval Task Team is developing a trainer approval system and want to make sure that this new system meets local needs and supports existing trainers. To do so, we need a more complete picture of who comprises our current trainer workforce, in order to have a better understanding of the supports needed to achieve the competency-based standards that will be adopted. Therefore, we are requesting that all trainers maintain a complete profile by submitting their documentation for verification: transcripts, certifications, and professional development documentation to the Registry now.
